I qualified MBBS in **1971** from Guy's Hospital and obtained the MRCP (UK) in **June 1974**. I was awarded the Diploma of MD from the University of London in **August 1982** and was elected FRCP in **April 1989**. I became Consultant Nephrologist at the St Peter's Hospitals and Honorary Senior Lecturer in Nephrology at the Institute of Urology in **November 1983**. I moved to the Middlesex Hospital when St Peter's became part of the UCLH Trust in **1992** and in **May 2005** the Renal Unit moved again to the Royal Free Hospital. My responsibilities included the care of patients with acute and chronic renal failure being treated with haemodialysis, peritoneal dialysis and renal transplantation. I retired from NHS practice in **January 2010** to concentrate on my private medical and medico-legal practice. I am accredited in Nephrology and General Internal Medicine and have previously been involved in undergraduate and post-graduate teaching of these subjects. I am author or co-author of over 140 publications, presentation and chapters covering various aspects of renal disease and clinical negligence, with details given in the accompanying CV. I am President of the MedicoLegal Society (**2012-2014**), member of the Expert Witness Institute and Academy of Experts, was Deputy Editor of the Medico-Legal Journal for 10 years and have been a member of the Editorial Committee for Clinical Risk (**October 2007**). I was awarded Cardiff University Expert Witness Accreditation (CUEW) in **November 2005**. I am recognised as a medical expert by the National Policing Improvement Authority (NPIA,SOCA **October 2006**) and the Fitness to Practice panel of the GMC (**March 2014**). I was a member of the Clinical Claims Review Group at UCL Hospitals for 5 years and I have served on Independent review panels for the NHS and provided expert evidence in the Civil, Criminal, Family and Coroner's Courts. I am a member of the Foreign Office pro bono medical panel which provides medical advice about British Nationals incarcerated abroad. Full details of my previous hospital experience and medical publications are given in the attached CV.

I have been involved in medico-legal practice for about 25 years and have prepared more than 1000 reports during that time. The work is about 80% Claimant, 15% Defence and 5% single joint expert and the routine turnaround time for a medical report is about 6 weeks. My areas of expertise include oxalate metabolism, specialist nephrology such as acute renal failure, renal transplantation, haemodialysis and chronic ambulatory peritoneal dialysis. I am familiar with the sort of renal problems which are commonly encountered in general medical practice such as those related to diabetes, hypertension and urinary tract infection. Because of my work at the Institute of Urology and Nephrology, I have particular experience of nephro-urological problems such as renal calculi, pre- and post-operative renal impairment, urinary tract diversions and other related urological problems.

CLINICAL and RESEARCH EXPERIENCE

I have been a Consultant Nephrologist since **1983** and retired from NHS Practice in **2010**. I have been Honorary Consultant Nephrologist at the Royal Free Hospital until **2013**. In the past I have been Clinical Director for Nephrology and Urology as well as the Consultant responsible for maintenance haemodialysis and chronic ambulatory peritoneal dialysis. My day to day work covers all aspects of specialist and general nephrology, including the management of acute and chronic renal failure, renal transplantation and dialysis. Because of my appointment with the Institute of Urology and Nephrology, I have particular experience with urological problems that have medical overtones. Examples include the management of urological case with renal impairment, those requiring intensive care and any variety of complex cases in which the patient is likely to be very sick with the possibility of dialysis or other active management of renal failure. This would include patients with severe renal calculi requiring removal by percutaneous or open surgical routes, patients with urinary diversions and subsequent metabolic complications and those patients with problems following laparoscopic surgery and chemotherapy for malignant disease.

I am principal author or co-author on over 100 publications including research articles, presentations to learned societies and chapters in books. The subjects covered can be summarised under the following headings:

1. Biochemical and clinical aspects of home dialysis, haemodialysis, chronic ambulatory peritoneal dialysis and their complications.
2. Aspects of metabolic side effects occurring during haemodialysis.
3. Pregnancy in renal transplant patients.
4. Medical management of stone disease, particularly cystinuria and hyperoxaluria.
5. All aspects of oxalate metabolism and management of primary hyperoxalurias.
6. Long term management of patients with renal transplant.
7. Renal problems related to surgery.
8. Clinical Negligence.
